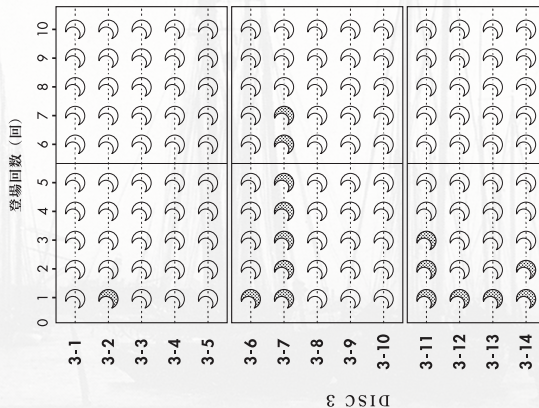

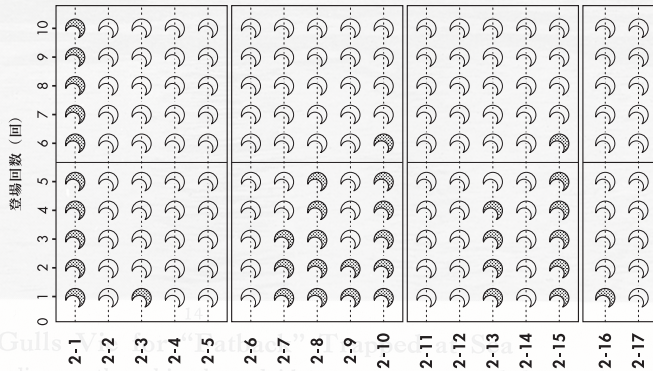

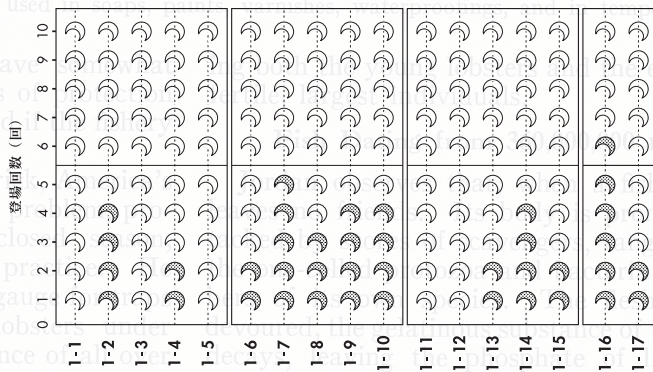

It is because of this condition that few traces of the earliest fishes of the geologic past have been left.
