Pig-faced Spotted Wings, Cracking on Batlike Wings, Appears to Fly Through Water

Rays often feed on clams, cracking shells with crushers in their mouths, and expelling the fragments like boys spitting melon seeds. Akin to sharks and sawfish, they have cartilaginous skeletons, and some species carry poisonous barbs on tails, using them with deadly accuracy against enemies. The high level of porpoises' ability to learn facts for each other and, on occasion, for marine biological breather, supply normally at least once every thirty seconds up to seven minutes. surface on top of the head, and lungs before the next learning hand in the water, they learn to leap high into the air to grasp the fish from the out-stretched hand.

Deadly Strength and Swift Speed

When aroused, porpoises become tough ad-versaries, ramming the sides of their finny opponents until death ensues. They are ex-tremely powerful. Often one will shove a rattle up and down and around the tank until the 200- or 300-pound creature de-velops an expression of silent desperation.

Porpoises in the oceanarium have weighed over 450 pounds. Their seemingly effortless speed has been clocked at 35 miles an hour in the open sea.

In this tank the Studios staff has witnessed the successful births of four baby porpoises. As a mammal, the mother nurses her baby for nearly a year before the little one learns to eat fish. But even new babies are able to swim along with the others. The female shields her offspring with her body to protect it from
